General Description: The main responsibility of the nursing student mentor is to be a resource to students in the practice lab. Mentors answer student questions and direct them to resources and allow for access to the staff when questions arise that need additional resources. Mentors observe students in the practice lab to ensure that the "practice" is done correctly using the appropriate techniques and observing etiquette of a professional health care environment.

Position Duties:

- 1. A resource providing support to students in the practice/open lab.
- 2. Answer student questions, direct them to resources and allow for access to the staff when questions arise that need additional resources.
- 3. Observe students in the practice lab to ensure that the "practice" is done correctly using the appropriate techniques and observing etiquette of a professional health care environment.
- 4. Provide feedback to the lab educators regarding student concerns or areas of weakness (This information is then shared with or presented to lead faculty on record for that specific course).
- 5. Meet student requests as needed for checking in/out lab items and ensuring that the student equipment sign out book has been signed/reviewed and simulation educators have been made aware of unreturned equipment.
- 6. Ensure that all daily to do lists are communicated well with other lab mentors through the student mentor communication log at the end of each shift.
- 7. Keep the lab clean and organized.
- 8. As needed, do laundry and lab linens.
- 9. May be asked to serve as standardized patients for simulations.
- 10. Assist in setup and take down of simulations.
- 11. Maintain a positive work environment.
- 12. Other duties as assigned.
